

MRS. SELMA SEIM
FUNERAL MONDAY

Stricken with a sudden heart attack about six o'clock Friday evening, Mrs. Selma Seim, 69, died four hours later at her home, on East Bismark road. Apparently she had been in good health during the day, and was about her home, as usual, until she suffered the attack.

Mrs. Seim, formerly Selma Wagner, was born in Germany on January 30, 1860. With her parents, she came to America in 1878 and on October 12 of that year was united in marriage with John Seim, of Grand Island. For some years after their marriage they resided on a farm northeast of this city, but in recent years had retired from farm life. Her husband passed away December 20, 1928.

Surviving are four sons, John, Edward and Frank, all of Chapman; Carl, of Grand Island; six daughters, Mrs. William Bruns, of Archer; Mrs. Wm. Tagge, of Shelton; Mrs. Wm. Jess, Mrs. Charles Rauert, Mrs. Edward Bader and Mrs. Ernest Tegler, all of Grand Island; as also thirty-five grandchildren, five great-grandchildren, two brothers, Bernard Wagner, of Broken Arrow, Okla.; Paul Wagner, of Worms; and two sisters, Mrs. Thomas Windfield, of Chapman; and Mrs. Richard Goehring, Sr., of Grand Island.

Funeral services will be held Monday afternoon, at two o'clock, from the Trinity Lutheran church on East Second street, of which she was a member, with Rev. A. J. Moeller officiating. A private service for the family, will be held at the home at 1:30 p. m. Burial will be in the Grand Island cemetery.
